

Vidyalayas. However, it was suggested that instead of going for modernization of laboratories of all schools in one go, initially 25% of KVs may be equipped with modern teaching aids and items for experiments to be done using Computers as mentioned in third and fourth column of Annexure II of the agenda item. It was also resolved to complete the target of 25% of KVs by July, 2014. For the selection of schools, it was decided that 125 Schools which have already been provided with 10 E-classrooms and 140 Schools identified as Cluster Level Training Centres (Annexure V page 38 of the agenda item) totaling 265 KVs in the first phase. It was also decided that rest of the KVs would be equipped with the proposed facilities within three years subsequently. So far as provision of computers (for the purpose of experiments to be done with the help of computer) is concerned, it was suggested that the existing computers in the school (if available) be utilized. Laboratories in the school may be provided with computers in case the same is not available.

Advisory the Academic Committee was approved by the Board.

While procuring these items order of preference should be Junior Science Lab, Physics Lab, Biology Lab., Chemistry Lab., Language Lab. And Mathematics Lab.

ITEM NO. 6(4):

To Upgrade ZIET, Mumbai as a National Level Training Institute.

The committee had a lengthy deliberation on the item of upgradation of ZIET, Mumbai as National Level Training Institute which will cater to the training needs of KVS Group A officers mainly besides training of teachers. The proposal was accepted principle by the Committee. However, following observations were made before taking up the proposal further:

i) Details about training of Group A officers of KVS to be provided.~

The recommendations of the Academic Advisory Committee was approved by the Board.



- ii) Action research to be included in the institutional profile of ZIET, Mumbai.
- iii) Existing infrastructure should be modernized and refurbished with proper planning.
- iv) Staffing pattern be reworked keeping in mind that ZIET, Mumbai will be an apex body so, an officer higher than Dy Commissioner level be appointed as Director.
- v) Till a new Hostel comes into being, the existing hostels may be refurbished and guest house/hostel facilities of nearby institution be utilized.
- vi) Financial proposal to be worked out.

ITEM NO. 6(5):

Revamping of Teachers Training Set -Up in Kendriya

Vidyalayas

During the discussion on the item members expressed concerned about number of days utilised by each Cluster Level training set up. The Joint Secretary, UT 2, MHRD also raised the issue of optimal utilization of number of days and number of schools to be used for training at cluster level. Therefore, the Committee resolved and agreed upon to create training infrastructure in one KV per region as Regional level training centres so that maximum utilization of the facility is there. Requirement may be worked out accordingly in terms of infrastructure and facilities for its consideration in the Finance Committee of KVS.

- a) Nomenclature of Librarian as TGT (Li S) is to be changed only if there are no financial implications involved.
- b) The post of Library Assistant is not to be created in those Schools where Library is small in size. The pay scale of Library Assistant also needs to be worked out.
- c) Only necessary equipment is to be provided in the Library.

The recommendations of the Academic Advisory Committee was approved by the Board.

ITEM NO. 6(8):

Creation of Research and Development (R & D) in KVS

The Committee agreed to the proposal to provide for innovation and experimentation in the functioning of KVS. It suggested that one Consultant/Adviser to KVs may be appointed with high credentials and proven reputation (who can think out of box) who would suggest excellent measures to be taken-up by KVS for retaining its reputation as a pace setting Organization.

The Board directed that instead of engaging a full time Consultant/ Advisor different experts can be engaged by KVS periodically. For financial implication, the total number of manhours could be suitably capped.

ITEM NO.10: STANDARD GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF DECISION OF BOG, KVS WITH RESPECT TO TRANSFER OF LAND FOR OPENING A NEW KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA IN CIVIL/DEFENCE SECTOR.

The Board approved the proposed standard guidelines for implementation of its decision in 94th BOG, KVS with respect to transfer of land for opening of new KV in Civil/Defence Sector as given under:

"On receipt of approval of Govt. of India for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector, the concerned sponsoring authority will be intimated about sanction of a new KV but necessary Administrative orders for opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya will be issued only after the identified and demarcated land is transferred to KVS on lease or permanent



transfer and its possession is also given to KVS. In case, the required extent of land is not transferred in favour of KVS within one year of intimation of sanction by KVS, then the said sanction of a new KV will be withdrawn and will be utilized for another suitable location. However, if the required extent of land is transferred within one year, then Administrative orders for opening of a new Kendriya Vidyalaya will be issued immediately after transfer of land, and the new KV will be opened in the temporary accommodation provided by the sponsoring authority."

However, with respect to new KVs of Defence Sector, the one year norms may be relaxed on the merit of the case.

ITEM NO. 11: CHANGE OF SPONSORSHIP OF KV, DAMANA (J&K) FROM DEFENCE SECTOR TO CIVIL SECTOR.

AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PERSONS ASSESSED.

The Board approved change of sponsorship of KV, Damana (J&K) from Defence Sector to Civil Sector as per agenda.

ITEM NO. 12: ADOPTION OF REVISED MODEL RECRUITMENT RULES/PAY SCALES FOR VARIOUS OFFICIAL LANGUAGE (OL) CADRE POSTS IN KVS ACCORDING TO DOPT, GOVT. OF INDIA OM NO. AB-14017/46/2011-ESTT (RR) DATED 19.09.2013.

The Board approved the Model Recruitment Rules and the pay scales ordered in the OM No.AB-14017/46/2011-Estt.(RR) dated 19.09.2013 of GOI, Ministry of Personnel, PG & Pensions, DOPT with the direction that the revised pay scales would be given prospectively only to those OL cadre posts incumbents of KVS who fulfill the eligibility conditions of Model RRs. It was also decided to obtain the approval of MHRD in this matter.

ITEM NO. 13: PROPOSAL FOR INTRODUCTION OF FIVE DAY WEEK FOR PRIMARY CLASSES IN KVS.

The Board approved the introduction of Five day week for Primary Classes in KVS as per the agenda item, placed at <u>Appendix –C</u>.

ITEM NO 14: WORKING HOURS OF TEACHERS

The Board did not approve the proposal. It was decided that a Committee be constituted to look into the working hours of teachers teaching classes IX to XII.

ITEM NO.15: SHIFTING OF KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA SANGATHAN REGIONAL OFFICE SIRSA (HARYANA) TO DELHI

The Board approved the shifting of KVS, RO, Sirsa in principle. However, Chairman desired to examine the feasibility of Gurgaon or Rohtak so that the establishment of this Regional Office of KVS remains in Haryana State.

ITEM NO. 16: TO CONSIDER AND APPROVE RELAXATION OF EXISTING ADMISSION GUIDELINES OF KVS AND GRANTING OF SPECIAL FACILITY TO KV NO.1 AND NO.2 KALPAKKAM IN ADMISSIONS.

The Board approved enhancement of discretionary quota of Chairman of Kendriya Vidyalayas No.1 & No.2, Kalpakkam from maximum 02 seats to maximum 10 seats. In the enhanced discretionary quota, neighborhood children would be given preference over children of employees of collaborating firms.

It was also decided that the enhancement of discretionary quota would be reviewed every year.

ABSORPTION OF THE INDIAN EMPLOYEES OF CENTRAL TIBETAN SCHOOLS ADMINISTRATION (CTSA) IN KVS ON TRANSFER OF CTSA SCHOOLS TO CENTRAL TIBETAN ADMINISTRATION (CTA) DHARAMSHALA.

The Board noted the approval accorded by the Chairman, KVS.

ANY OTHER ITEM WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR

The issue related to shortage of funds in KVS during current Financial Year 2013-14 was deliberated. It was also informed that MHRD sanctioned only Rs. 14 Crore as additionally in 2013-14 compared to the year 2012-13. It was decided that a D.O. letter will be written by Secretary (SE&L), Ministry of HRD to Secretary (Expenditure), Ministry of

Finance as regards to release of additional funds to meet salary and pensionery obligation on part of KVS in the current financial year. Further, Financial Advisor, Ministry of HRD and KVS representative will meet on day to day basis to resolve this issue.

In the end, Chairman desired that teachers of KVs should be provided proper space and other facilities in staff room of Vidyalayas. He also desired that counseling of children should be arranged in schools in such a way that the identity of students, while going for individual counseling, is protected and process remains inconspicuous. Group counseling of students may take place in class room.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to Chair.





INTRODUCTION OF FIVE DAY WEEK FOR PRIMARY CLASSES IN KVS.

RTE Act 2009 envisages 200 working days for Class I to Class V and 220 working days for classes VI – VIII (see section 19 and 25 of RTE Act 2009 under "The Schedule"). This difference in working days of Primary classes and Classes VI to VIII vis-a-vis working days of KVs has been examined and the following is outlined accordingly.

Article 92(F) of Education Code for KVs prescribes 234 days for all classes. But now, if KVs would be working for 05 days in a week, the no. of working days will be changed from 234 to 207 i.e 234 days minus 27 Saturdays).

A committee was constituted to assess the feasibility of introducing 5 day week policy in the KVs in which the students will be given off on Saturdays and staff will have normal working hours (except on 2nd Saturday) to undertake various activities. The committee members evaluated the working of the existing system and had an intensive assessment of the existing system. The members had a critical assessment of pros & cons of the proposed policy and the findings are summed up as below:

- 1. The students can have enough time for self paced learning
- 2. The students would get ample time to pursue hobbies/interests.
- 3. It reduces energy consumption in school buildings as well as on roads.
- 4. It provides space for smooth and effective conduct of activities for secondary and senior secondary students such as exhibitions, scout & guide activities, youth parliament, club activities, medical check up etc.
- 5. Parent teacher meetings can be organized more meaningfully and fruitfully in the primary section.
- 6. Primary teachers would get sufficient time for planning their schedules and activities and also for maintaining all the required records of CCE.
- 7. There would be more time for staff development programmes in schools.

Conclusion: After careful analysis of the report submitted by Expert Committee, it can be concluded that the 5 day week for Primary students in KVs can be implemented without compromising the teaching and learning. Many CBSE affiliated schools in the country are also following 5 day week in their schools successfully. There is a strong feeling among the teachers, parents and students that 5 day working system would have many advantages.

Hence, it is proposed to have 5 day week arrangement for students of Primary classes (Classes 1 to 5) from the academic session 2014-15 in compliance of the provisions contained in RTE Act 2009. However, teachers would continue to work on all six days in a week.

The Board may consider and approve the same.
