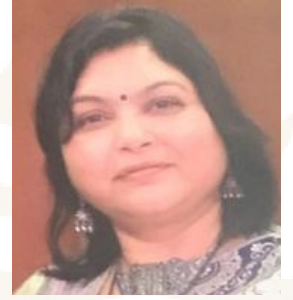

एक भारत : श्रेष्ठ भारत (प्रतिवेदन)

एक भारत श्रेष्ठ भारत कार्यक्रम का उद्देश्य राज्य / संघ राज्य क्षेत्र की अवधारणा के माध्यम से विभिन्न राज्यों / केंद्र शासित प्रदेशों के लोगों के बीच आपसी तालमेल बढ़ाने और आपसी समझ को बढ़ावा देना है। युग्मित राज्य की भाषा सीखने, संस्कृति, परंपराओं और संगीत, पर्यटन और भोजन, खेल और सर्वोत्तम प्रथाओं के साझाकरण आदि क्षेत्रों में एक निरंतर और के०वि०सं० द्वारा संरचित सांस्कृतिक संपर्क को बढ़ावा देने के लिए गतिविधियां करते हैं।

सरदार वल्लभभाई पटेल की जयंती के उपलक्ष्य में 31 अक्टूबर, 2015 को आयोजित राष्ट्रीय एकता दिवस के दौरान विभिन्न क्षेत्रों के लोगों के बीच एक निरंतर और संरचित सांस्कृतिक संपर्क का विचार प्रधानमंत्री श्री नरेंद्र मोदी द्वारा व्यक्त किया गया ; जिसे केन्द्रीय विद्यालय संगठन द्वारा तब से प्रतिवर्ष पूरी निष्ठा के साथ समस्त केन्द्रीय विद्यालयों में आयोजित किया जाता है।

माननीय प्रधानमंत्री ने प्रतिपादित किया कि 'सांस्कृतिक विविधता एक खुशी है' जिसे विभिन्न राज्यों और केंद्रशासित प्रदेशों के लोगों के बीच पारस्परिक संपर्क और पारस्परिकता के माध्यम से मनाया जाना चाहिए, ताकि देश भर में समझ की एक सामान्य भावना प्रतिध्वनित हो।

देश के प्रत्येक राज्य और केन्द्र शासित प्रदेश को एक समय अवधि के लिए किसी अन्य राज्य / केंद्र शासित प्रदेश के साथ जोड़ा जाता है; इस दौरान वे भाषा, साहित्य, भोजन, त्योहारों, सांस्कृतिक कार्यक्रमों, पर्यटन आदि के क्षेत्र में एक दूसरे के साथ एक संरचित साझा करेंगे। उपरोक्त बिन्दुओं के मद्देनजर केन्द्रीय विद्यालय संगठन, लखनऊ उत्तर प्रदेश में कोविड-19 महामारी को ध्यान में रखते हुए भाषा संगम के अंतर्गत विद्यालय स्तर पर विभिन्न कार्यक्रम ऑनलाइन संपन्न किये गए।



लखनऊ संभाग को मेघालय के साथ जोड़ा गया। इस अवधि के दौरान, लखनऊ संभाग के विद्यार्थियों ने मेघालय प्रदेश के महत्वपूर्ण शब्दों को सीखने का प्रयास किया। खासी, गारो, जयंतिया भाषाओं को आपसी बातचीत में शामिल किया गया तथा इसका वीडियो वर्चुअल मीडिया के माध्यम से साझा किया गया; साथ ही मेघालय में उत्तर प्रदेश के व्यंजन पेश करने वाले उत्सव की झाकियां भी प्रस्तुत की गयीं।

लखनऊ संभाग के विद्यार्थियों ने मेघालय के लोक नृत्य, जबकि मेघालय के विद्यार्थियों द्वारा उत्तर प्रदेश के लोक नृत्य, खानपान आदि कार्यक्रमों आदि का ऑनलाइन प्रदर्शन किया। युग्मित राज्य के सांस्कृतिक अंगीकरण के इस पैटर्न का सभी राज्यों और केंद्र शासित प्रदेशों द्वारा अनुसरण किया जाता है।

Meghalaya

Meghalaya meaning "abode of clouds" is a state in Northeast India. Meghalaya was formed by carving out two districts from the state of Assam: the United Khasi Hills and Jaintia Hills, and the Garo Hills on 21 January 1972. The population of Meghalaya as of 2016 is estimated to be 3,211,474.

Meghalaya covers an area of approximately 22,430 square kilometres, with a length-to-breadth ratio of about 3:1.

The state is bound to the south by the Bangladeshi divisions of Mymensingh and Sylhet, to the west by the Bangladeshi division of Rangpur, and to the north and east by India's State of Assam. The capital of Meghalaya is Shillong. During the British rule of India, the British imperial authorities nicknamed it the "Scotland of the East".



Meghalaya was previously part of Assam, but on 21 January 1972, the districts of Khasi, Garo and Jaintia hills became the new state of Meghalaya. English is the official language of Meghalaya. Unlike many Indian states, Meghalaya has historically followed a matrilineal system where the lineage and inheritance are traced through women; the youngest daughter inherits all wealth and she also takes care of her parents.

The state is the wettest region of India, with the wettest areas in the southern Khasi Hills recording an average of 12,000 mm (470 in) of rain a year. About 70 percent of the state is forested. The Meghalaya subtropical forests ecoregion encompasses the state; its mountain forests are distinct from the lowland tropical forests to the north and south. The forests are notable for their biodiversity of mammals, birds, and plants.

Meghalaya has predominantly an agrarian economy with a significant commercial forestry industry. The important crops are potatoes, rice, maize, pineapples, bananas, papayas, spices, etc. The service sector is made up of real estate and insurance companies. Meghalaya's gross state domestic product for 2012 was estimated at ₹16,173 crore (US\$2.3 billion) in current prices. The state is geologically rich in minerals, but it has no significant industries. The state has about 1,170 km (730 mi) of national highways. It is also a major logistical center for trade with Bangladesh.





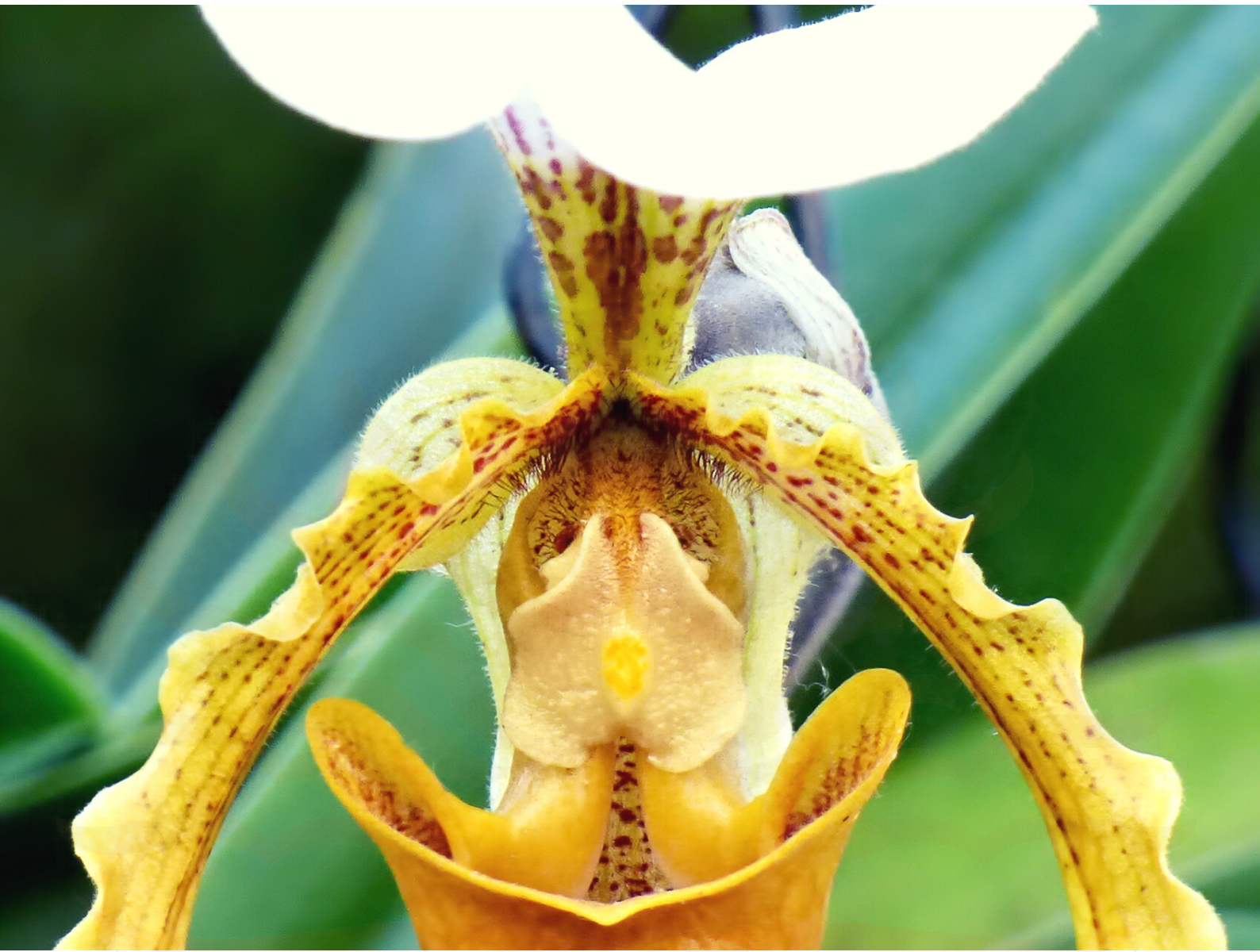
Clouded Leopard: State Animal of Meghalaya

The clouded leopard (*Neofelis nebulosa*) is a wild cat inhabiting dense forests from the foothills of the Himalayas through mainland Southeast Asia into southern China. The first clouded leopard known to science was brought to London from China in the early 19th century and described in 1821.



Hill Myna: State Bird of Meghalaya

State Bird of Meghalaya: The common hill myna (*Gracula religiosa*), sometimes spelled "mynah" and formerly simply known as the hill myna or myna bird, is the myna most commonly seen in aviculture. It is a member of the starling family (Sturnidae).



Lady's Slipper Orchid: State Flower of Meghalaya

Paphiopedilum insigne is a species of orchid endemic to the Indian states of Assam and **Meghalaya** and the Myanmar states of Kachin, Shan and Kayar. It is known as (Ngwe nar phyu) in Myanmar. It is the type species of the genus *Paphiopedilum*.



Gamhar: State Tree of Meghalaya

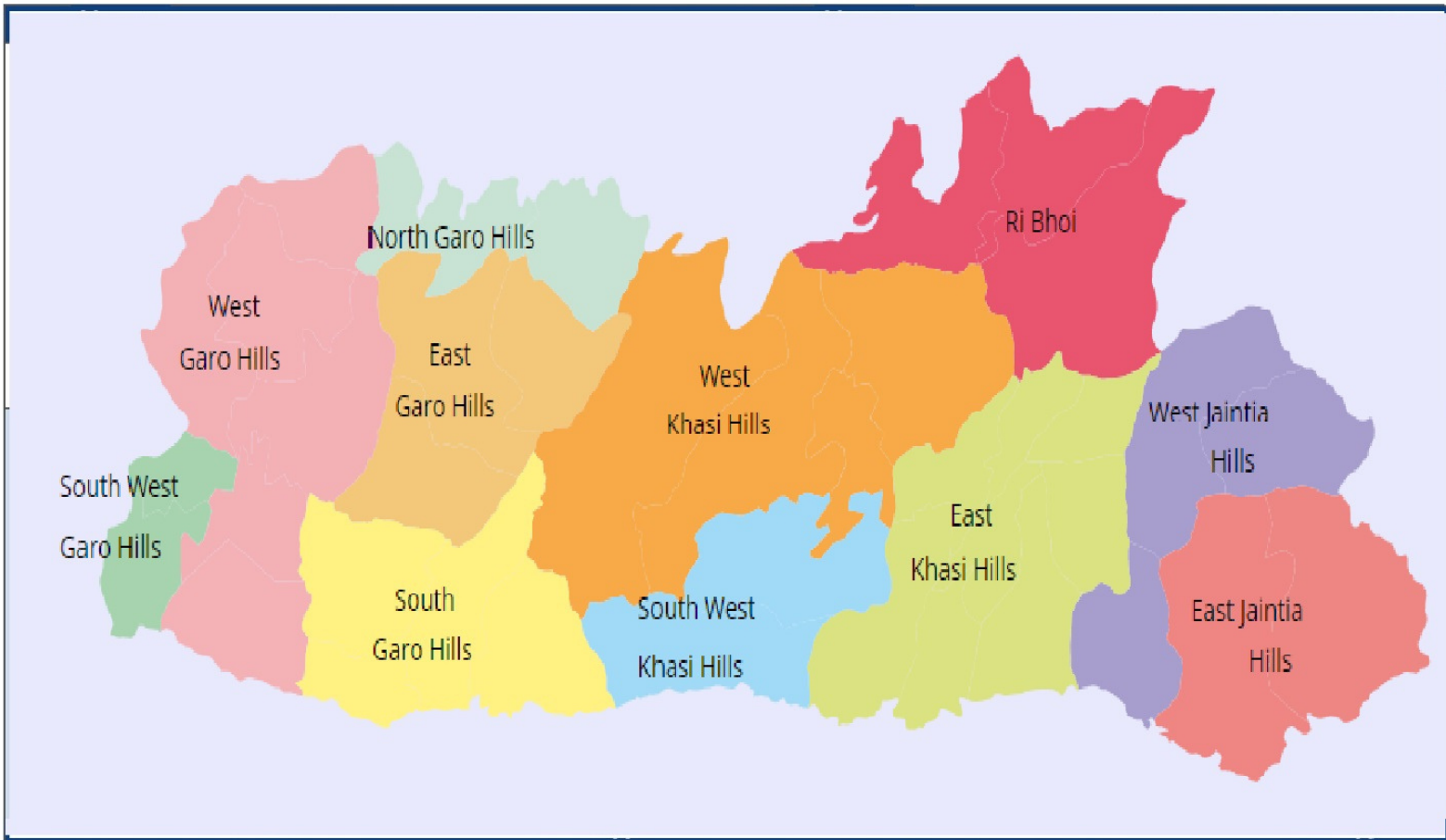
Gmelina arborea, locally known as gamhar, is a fast-growing deciduous tree in the family Lamiaceae. *Gmelina arborea* wood is pale yellow to cream-coloured or pinkish-buff when fresh, turning yellowish brown on exposure.

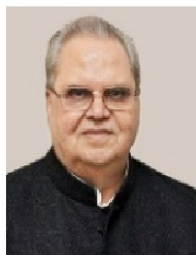

Additional Information: About The Hon'ble Governor:

Honourable Governor Shri Satya Pal Malik (born 24th July, 1946) was appointed as Governor of Meghalaya by Hon'ble President Shri Ram Nath Kovind on the 18th August, 2020 and assumed office as 21st Governor of the state on 19th August, 2020. Shri Malik has been a former Union Minister, Parliamentarian and politician serving in many capacities in his long career both at the state and Central Government.

He was the 18th Governor of Goa from 3rd November 2019 to August 2020. Shri Malik was also the last Governor of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. He was the Governor of Jammu and Kashmir from August 2018 to October 2019, and it was during his tenure that the constitutional decision to abrogate Article 370, which gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir, was taken on 5th August, 2019.

His first prominent stint as a politician was as a member of Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly during 1974-77. He represented Uttar Pradesh in Rajya Sabha from 1980-86 and 1986-89. He was member of the 9th Lok Sabha from Aligarh, from 1989 to 1991, as member of Janata Dal. He was Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs and Tourism in the year 1990. He was the Governor of Bihar from October 2017 to August 2018. On 21st March 2018 he was also given additional charge to serve as Governor of Odisha up to 28th May, 2018. In August 2018, he was appointed as Governor to the crucial state of Jammu and Kashmir.

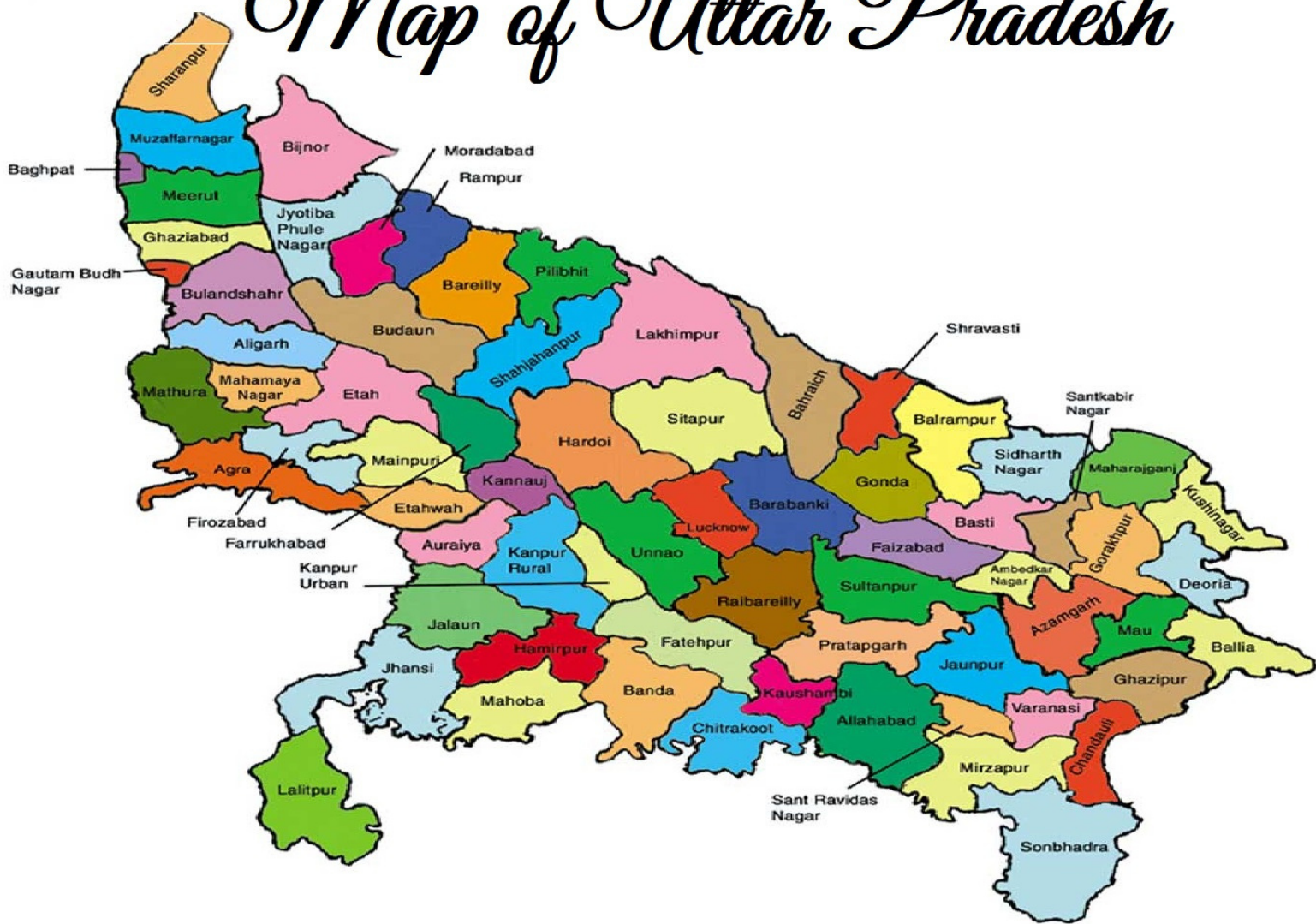




Map of Meghalaya



Map of Uttar Pradesh

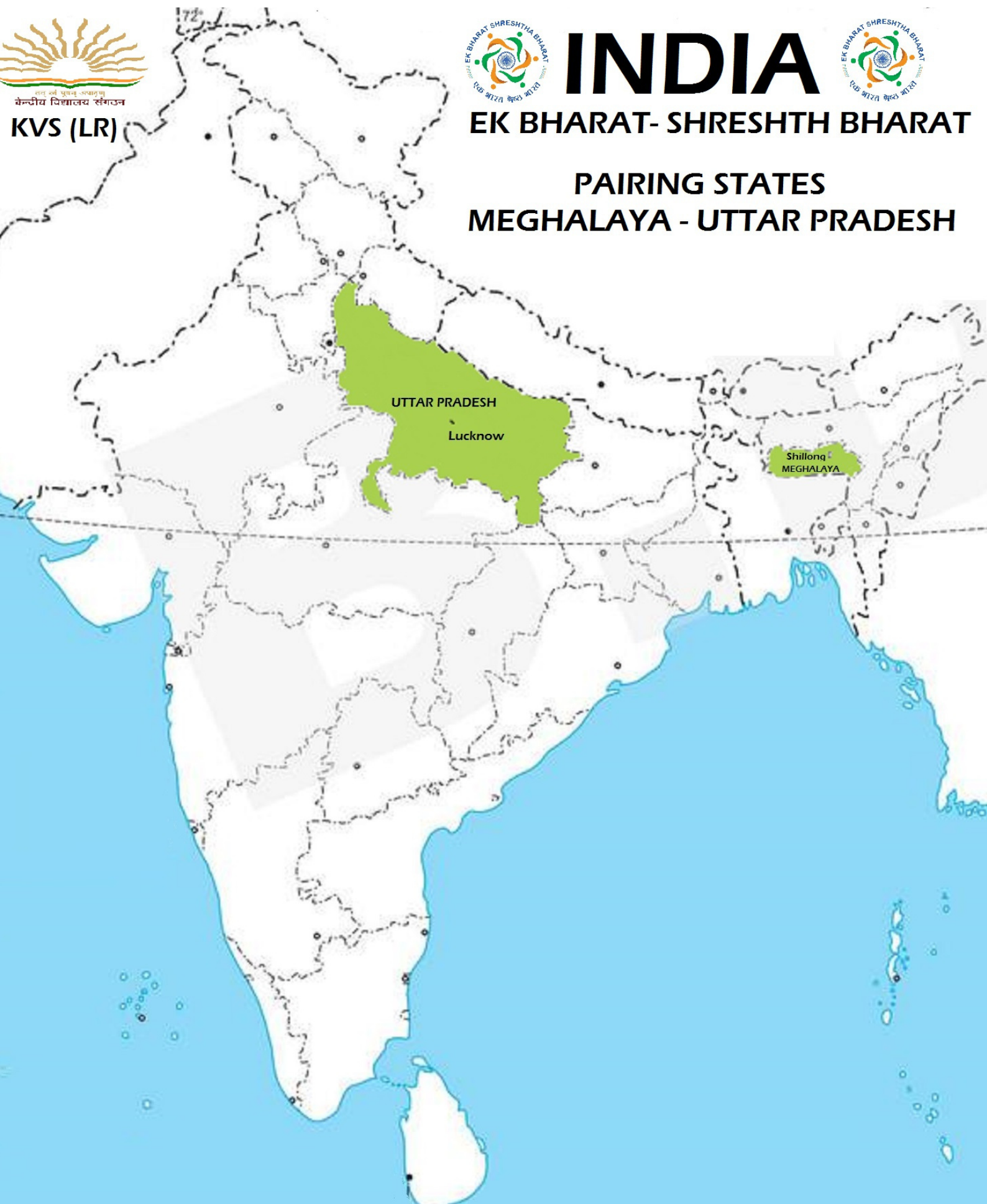


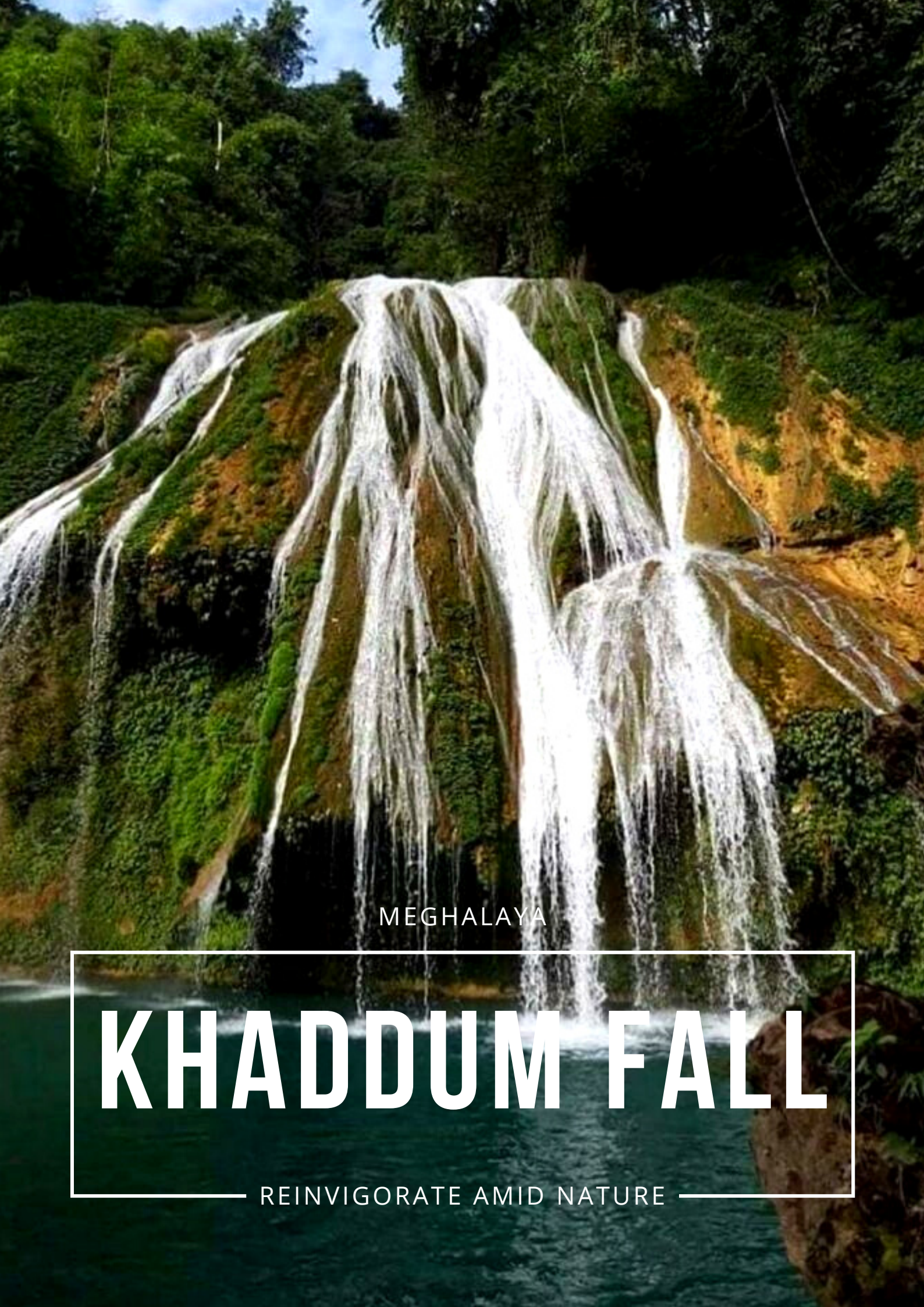
